- Youth speak – learn & use the jargon of young people in the UK and the US. Learn the up-to-date phrases that teenagers are using.
- Anecdotes – everybody likes to hear a good anecdote and developing for telling then is a useful skill.
- Active listening – sometimes the problem isn't speaking but listening. Do we really listen to each other? Learn and practise skills that will mean you're really listening and not just hearing what you think is being said.
